6.01 NOMINATING METHOD TO BE USED. All candidates for elective municipal offices shall be nominated under the provisions of Chapter 45 of the Code of Iowa.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 376.3)

6.02 NOMINATIONS BY PETITION. Nominations for elective municipal offices of the City may be made by nomination paper or papers signed by not less than ten eligible electors, residents of the City.

6.03 ADDING NAME BY PETITION. The name of a candidate placed upon the ballot by any other method than by petition shall not be added by petition for the same office.

6.04 PREPARATION OF PETITION AND AFFIDAVIT. Each eligible elector who signs a nominating petition shall add to the signature the elector's residence address and date of signing. The person whose nomination is proposed by the petition shall not sign it. Each candidate shall complete and file a signed, notarized affidavit of candidacy. The affidavit shall be filed at the same time as the nomination petition. The affidavit shall be in the form prescribed by the Secretary of State and shall include information required by the Code of Iowa.

6.05 FILING, PRESUMPTION, WITHDRAWALS, OBJECTIONS. The time and place of filing nomination petitions, the presumption of validity thereof, the right of a candidate so nominated to withdraw and the effect of such withdrawal, and

the right to object to the legal sufficiency of such petitions, or to the eligibility of the candidate, shall be governed by the appropriate provisions of Chapter 44 of the Code of Iowa.

6.06 PERSONS ELECTED. The candidates who receive the greatest number of votes for each office on the ballot are elected, to the extent necessary to fill the positions open.

6.10 PRECINCT NO. 1. This precinct shall encompass all lands north of Highway 44, which are within the incorporated city limits of the City of Grimes, Iowa; this precinct includes the recently annexed territory taken from census block number 1915301 13001019 described as a tract of land whose northern boundary is defined by a line which is the southern boundary of the eastern half of census block 1915301 13001011 if said line continued due west through James Street; said line continues due west for 1,360 feet from the centerline of James Street; then south for 1,030 feet; then due east for 1,360 feet to enclose the rectangle of annexed territory within the incorporated limits of the city of Grimes, Iowa.

6.11 PRECINCT NO. 2. This precinct shall encompass all lands south of Highway 44, which are within the incorporated city limits of the City of Grimes.

6.11A DALLAS COUNTY RESIDENTS IN CITY OF GRIMES ELECTIONS.

For any City of Grimes citywide election, citizens of the city of Grimes who live in Dallas County shall vote in Precinct No. 2.

6.11B DALLAS COUNTY RESIDENTS IN COUNTY, STATE AND NATIONAL ELECTIONS. For any county, state or national election, any citizen of Grimes who lives in Dallas County shall vote in Dallas County, in the Walnut/Grimes/Urbandale Precinct.
